On April 5th, all our students will place a sunflower on the grass field (which they are currently making in class) The sunflower is the national flower of Ukraine.

SEARCHERS NEWS

This is a summary of updates that have been developed to complement guidance from the BC centre for Disease Control (Public Health Communicable Disease Guidance for K-12 schools) and WorksafeBC.

1. Space Arrangement

-schools can return to classroom and learning enviorment configurations and activities that best meet learner needs and preferred educational approaches, with consideration of strategies to create space between people.

2. School Gatherings and Events

-Intra-school events (events with just students, staff and necessary volunteers) do not have a capacity limit.

-inter-school events of those with visitors (e.g., parent spectators) should not exceed 50% capacity. On April 7th 2022, the PHO Gatherings & Events Order is expected to lift to return to 100% capacity.

-the transition to 100% will also be in consultation with our Elementary Athletic Commission (EAC)

-schools will continue to create a supportive school enviorment, including utilizing a trauma informed lens when planning school activities.

3. Visitor Access/Community Use

-schools can return to routine sign in/sign out practises (visitors and volunteers, etc.)

4. Illness & Self- Assessment Policies and Protocols

-children that are not fully vaccinated are no longer restricted from being in congregate settings such as schools upon return from travelling. Wear a mask for 14 days after returning is an easier price to pay than missing school for 14 days.

-follow protocols as outlined in our 'Communicable Disease Prevention Plan'

5. Personal Protective Equipment

-the decision to wear a mask or face covering is a personal choice for staff, students and visitors. A person's choice is to be supported and respected. Masks and face coverings are not mandated.

This update took effect the first day back from spring break. Everyone in schools continues to be encouraged to do a daily health check, stay home when sick and to practice hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette.
