> On behalf of the entire staff and my family, I would like to extend to you and your families the love, joy and hope that comes with this season, as we celebrate the birth of Christ




HOW TO DRESS FOR THE SEASON

IN CASE OF SNOW



BC's provincial health officer, Dr. Bonnie Henry, was asked last week whether she had given any thought to starting the winter break earlier.
