




The Jesus Peacemaker Cross, an original, one-ofa-kind piece, was handcrafted by Dominican Sisters, Sister Claire and Sister Magdalene, at the Queen of Peace Monastery.

It was constructed by Diego Campanile from wood taken from the original school building.

The significance of this cross, central to St. Helen's School's educational faith base mission for over 100 years, will carry forward into the new future home of the East Wing.

Valued at \$1 million, this cross is a profound donation toward the construction of the new East Wing, a project we aim to commence as soon as possible.


This very special cross will initiate the funds for our East Wing project which will include the new parish office and new school wing.

Uniform Information

We have received more information from McCarthy uniforms regarding their materials. *Please read the statement below from the company.*

"There will be chemicals used in the fabric dying process and printing process, but all are to a Canadian and global safe standard for usage.

We don't use PFA's in any of our manufacturing processes, which are the forever chemicals that can be cause for concern – a couple of years ago these were identified in some supplier's uniforms for items that are stain resistant, waterproof or water resistant clothing".

During our one year transition (2024-2025), students are permitted to wear their yellow gym shirt on gym days, or their centennial gear during the week. Students are permitted to wear their gym strip only on their class's designated gym days, with the exception of special occasions such as field trips, assemblies, Church gatherings, etc. On these special days students must be in their full uniform.

No extension will be given past the one year mark. If you require financial help, we have gently used uniforms and vouchers from McCarthy Uniform. Supply is limited.

For a cotton t-shirt, it would be a navy version of the Gildan t-shirt we previously supplied in gold, in either 100% cotton or in a 50/50 blend. With the printing being front and back, they would be the same price as the dri-fit t-shirts.

School uniforms in independent schools play a crucial role in fostering unity and instilling a sense of pride and belonging among students. They also help students stay focused on their studies by minimizing distractions.
